Frozentoesen Fun Continues in February!

Toledo, Ohio—The Toledo Zoo's **Frozentoesen** is a celebration of all things winter, and with half-price admission, ice-carving demonstrations and Cabin Fever Feeds, it's a great way for your family to dig the cool! And this year there are even more reasons to make the Zoo your wintertime destination.

The Toledo School for the Arts will heat things up in February as they bring the tropical sounds of **Glass City Steel** and **Afro-Caribbean Dance and Drums** on **Saturday, February 6**. The **Toledo Ballet** will perform on **Sunday, February 14**, and then the **Toledo School for the Arts** returns on **February 20-21 and 27-28** to perform **Chocolate Soup**.
